Admission/Parking: Admission is free. Free parking is located at the Civic Center, Chippewa Valley High School and Erie Elementary. A free shuttle will bring you to the Art Festival. Handicap parking is available at the Civic Center.

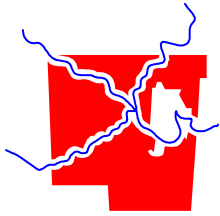

Explore the historic aspects of your community

History plays a big role in the annual Festival of the Senses as the event takes place adjacent to the township's Historic Village. Members of the Historical Commission will be on hand dressed in 18th and 19th century clothes to explain the significance of the log cabin and Old Moravian Hall that comprise the Historic Village.

The recently constructed Garden Pergola donated by the former Rose Gardens will also be on display. There will be demonstrations of early American activities including corn shucking, blacksmithing, early American music and plenty of games for children.
